

## Belchford& Fulletby Annual Parish Meeting 22<sup>nd</sup> May

The meeting was held at St Peter & St Paul Church, Belchford and commenced with a minutes silence in memory of the late Mrs Abbott. The parish council wish to plant a tree in memory of Mrs Abbott and possibly install a bench. Members of the public were thanked for their attendance and asked if they knew of anyone affected by the Covid pandemic who were in need of assistance, to please get in touch. Projects undertaken by the parish council were outlined and ideas for the future were discussed. The annual Lane Letting took place. Lanes were auctioned raising £295 which will be used to purchase trees in memory of Mrs Mary Abbott.

The meeting started with the election of a Chairman, Vice Chairman & RFO for the next 12 months and the Annual Governance & Accountability Return was completed for the financial period to 31.03.2021. 

The Parish Council has been working with Openreach to establish costs for upgrading the existing moderate speed fibre-copper (FTTC) and, for some of you, very slow copper only broadband to extremely fast full fibre broadband (FTTP). The initial quotation of £575,000 for both villages is excessive exceeding the value of government grants. It is high due to the large number of outlying properties, some of which are several kilometres from the telecommunications cabinets in the villages. We are currently looking at ways to reduce the cost and will update you in future newsletters. In the meantime for this initiative to succeed we continue to need your support. You might feel that your current broadband speed, which for many of us is approx. 20 to 60mB, is sufficient for your needs but the lessons of the past are that you are very likely to require much higher speeds in the future. In addition, the copper network for both voice and data will become redundant in less than 10 years' time and small villages will not be a priority to upgrade. We hope that you would like to be included in the full fibre initiative and, if so, can you please email your name, full address and landline telephone number to ian@goodall-geoscience.co.uk to register your interest. If you run a business, charity or school from this address please let us know as these are eligible for a higher UK government grant.
